














#### Merry Edwards Winery

Merry Edwards Winery was founded in 1997 and produces terroir-driven, single-vineyard pinot noirs from 80 acres of estate vineyards in the Russian River Valley. Over two decades, as Merry assembled a stellar collection of vineyards, she employed meticulous attention to detail to become known for crafting wines of immense depth, elegant structure, and exceptional longevity.

Now a Certified California Sustainable Winery, the brand entered a new chapter after CLR purchased the winery in 2019 and Merry's retirement in 2020. Merry's handpicked successor, Winemaker Heidi von der Mehden, and Winery President Nicole Carter have taken up exactly where Merry left off and will continue to make wines treasured by legions of Merry Edwards' fans well into the future

#### Winemaking:

All Pinot fermentation tanks (heated and cooled at the flip of a switch ) are open-top, but fully convertible to closed-topped tanks for blending and storage.

Pneumatic stainless steel foot operated by a joy stick.

The commitment to barrel ferment 100% of the Sauvignon Blanc continues. This allows for an intensive, twice-weekly lees stirring, body-building regime. Like her Pinot, this wine ages solely in French oak cooperage, 18 % new.

Bottling is delayed until April of the year following the vintage in order to allow full development of the wine's rich character.

#### Merry Edwards

"The wines are 75 percent made when the grapes arrive at the winery door. My job is just to not screw things up!" Merry Edwards

Merry is a California winemaking legend, and one of the first woman winemakers. 1970, Merry Vintners label, while studying her bachelor of science degree in physiology at UC Berkeley.

In 1973, she earned a master's degree in Food Science with an emphasis in Oenology. (1 of 3 women in her master's program, only Merry became a winemaker). Worked as winemaker (Mount Eden and Matanzas Creek), and consulted for dozens of wineries.

1997, Merry launched Merry Edwards Winery and Vineyards. After 47 vintages as a winemaker, Merry retired in February 2020.

#### Clone 37

In 1975, Merry selected cuttings from Mount Eden's pinot noir vineyard and sent them to UC Davis for heat treatment (to remove virus) and propagation. This field selection was then named UCD clone 37 (also known as the "Merry Edwards selection") and became a star performer in the Russian River Valley. It is known for producing beautiful wines with complex aromatics, deep color, and velvety tannins.



#### Heidi von der Mehden

A Sonoma County native and trained scientist who spent more than two years in the Peace Corps in Africa.

After receiving a degree in chemistry from Santa Clara University in 1997 and teaching high school chemistry in Tanzania, she returned to Sonoma County to work as a lab technician and then enologist for Kenwood Vineyards.

After three years as assistant winemaker at Mauritson Winery, Heidi jumped at the opportunity to work with Richard Arrowood as associate winemaker in 2007 before taking over as winemaker in 2010.

2015, Merry tapped Heidi as her successor, and the two worked side by side until Merry's retirement in 2020...

#### Nicole Carter

As President of Roederer Collection USA (Merry Edwards Winery in the Russian River Valley; Diamond Creek Vineyards in the Napa Valley; and Roederer Estate, Domaine Anderson and Scharffenberger Cellars in the Anderson Valley), Nicole is responsible for all aspects of the operations at all five properties. She has more than 20 years of marketing, winemaking and viticulture, sales, and export experience, including most recently serving as the Chief Marketing Officer and Director of Winemaking for Hess Family Wine Estates. Nicole spent 18 years with Treasury Wine Estates in several global marketing and public relations roles. She is a Certified Specialist of Wine and holds additional certifications from the Court of Master Sommeliers, the Wine and Spirits Education Trust and the Culinary Institute of America Wine School in Napa Valley.

New Oak: 18% French, bâtonnage twice per week

Aging: 5 months in barrel

- Grapes were hand-picked and hand sorted in the field
- Whole cluster press
- Barrel fermented
- Clones Shenandoah (Clone 1), Sauvignon Musquè
- Bottled April 2023

This wine opens with enticing aromas of Meyer lemon, white pineapple, lime zest and white blossoms. On the palate, ripe yellow stone fruit and lemon grass mingle with notes of honeydew and marzipan. The texture is silky, but the bright acidity keeps the wine fresh and lively.

#### **Food Pairing**

Pairs beautifully with Kaffir lime and coconut soup with black cod. The combination of Kaffir lime and coconut milk with the slightly spicy broth makes an outstanding pairing with our Sauvignon Blanc.

New Oak: 47% new French oak

Aging: Aged sur lie 9 months Bottling Date: August 4, 2022

Fully destemmed, berries are cold-soaked for five days. The 2021 vintage aged in 47% new French oak for nine months, allowing the wine time to rest on the lees, gaining depth and mouthfeel. This regime has led to a Pinot Noir of great balance, foretelling of a long life ahead.

Clones: UCD 37, Dijon 115, 667, 777, and Pommard.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The aromas on the nose are red-fruit driven, featuring ripe raspberries and fresh strawberries with a pretty hint of vanilla. On entry, this wine is bright and buoyed by refreshing acidity, and a persistent core of tannins brings elegant texture. Hints of yellow fruit skin and gravel give way to a slightly spicy finish highlighted by notes of blood orange and cherry cola.

Fully destemmed, berries are cold-soaked for seven days. The 2020 vintage aged in 20% new French oak for ten months, allowing the wine time to rest on the lees, gaining depth and mouthfeel. This regime has led to a Pinot Noir of great balance, foretelling of a long life ahead.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The inviting nose offers up scents of Santa Rosa red plums, cassis, dried sweet figs and pomegranate backed by sandalwood and hints of tea rose. Bright and exciting on the palate, the entry begins with firm tannins and complex layers of red raspberries, bergamot tea, dried herbs and rose petal notes. Refreshing acidity carries the wine throughout the finish.

All grapes are hand-picked at night and hand-sorted in the vineyard and at the winery. 100% destemmed and cold soaked for six days. Fermented in small lots so that individual clones can be treated respectfully. A combination of Dijon 667 and Merry's own UCD37 clones are highly successful on this site and thus forms a strong foundation for this stunning wine. Vegan-friendly.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The 2021 Meredith Estate features floral essences of peony, plumeria and rose. The nose of this deeply layered wine offers hints of toasted nuts, Bing cherry, tangerine and cedar. Seductive and silky tannins mark the entry, with black cherry, dark chocolate and fresh earth leading to a long, elegant finish.

#### Winemaking

- grapes hand-picked and hand-sorted in the vineyard followed by a second pass at the winery.
- 100% whole cluster pressed.

- 9 months aging in French oak with lees-stirring done twice weekly.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The 2021 single-vineyard Chardonnay is classic Olivet Lane: bright and luscious. Scents of fresh summer peaches, kiwi, lemon zest, white flowers and lush butterscotch rise from the glass. The bright entry leads to a core of juicy acidity. This wine dances across your palate, with a warm toasty finish featuring accents of yellow stone fruit, cream soda and honeycomb.

On the western benchland of the Santa Rosa Plain, Olivet Lane is one of the oldest existing Pinot vineyards in the appellation. The winery has produced a single vineyard bottling from Olivet Lane every year since founding the Merry Edwards brand in 1997.

Aromas of cherries, violets and fresh strawberries along with subtle earthy notes of forest floor and mushroom.

The entry is round and lush, balanced on the palate—overall a well-structured wine supported by oak. A dusting of pretty brown spice and a hint of cream soda linger on the finish. Given some time in the bottle, this elegant and engaging wine will continue to develop for years to come.

Aging: 10 months in 42% new French oak

Grapes were hand-picked and hand sorted in the field and at the winery. 100% destemmed with whole berries added to the fermenter and cold soaked for three days. Aged 10 months in 42% new French oak and bottled in July 2023.

#### **Tasting Notes**

On the nose, notes of blue fruit, stone fruit, ripe wild berries and strawberries mingle with hints of forest floor and a savory, meaty component. The completely balanced entry features pretty floral, herbal and spice accents of oregano and thyme, showing good depth but still light on its feet. Notes of anise linger on the fine finish.

# PIO CESARE Federica Boffa 5th generation

#### Pio Cesare

Established in 1881, the esteemed Piedmontese producer of Barolo and Barbaresco is run by fifth generation members of the family—Federica and Cesare, the late Pio Boffa's daughter and nephew, respectively. The family's 170-acre collection of prized parcels of varying exposures, combined with restrained yields and a focus on quality over quantity (production is intentionally limited to roughly 40,000 cases each year), allow Pio Cesare to produce traditional expressions of the Langhe's diverse terroirs.







Founded in 1881, 5<sup>th</sup> generation still carry the family biz.

173 acres of hillside vineyards, with premium exposures in Piedmont region between the Alps and the Mediterranean sea.

BAROLO: 79 acres (51 acres planted with Nebbiolo for Barolo)

BARBARESCO: 66 acres (35 acres planted with

Pio Cesare's unique winemaking method relies on minimal intervention to produce classic wines of distinctive character.

Following an exhaustive selection of grapes down to the single berry, the techniques employed in the cellar include shorter maceration, separate lot fermentation, judicious selection for barrel and large cask aging,

#### Pio Cesare Barolo Pio DOCG 2019

100% Nebbiolo

The grapes are sourced from family-owned.

Vinification takes place in **stainless** steel tanks, with **skin contact for about 30 days**. The wine is **aged** in mid-toasted **French** oak for three years: 70 percent in 20 to 50 hectoliter casks; 30 percent in barriques.


A traditional vintage delivering fresh fruits and beautiful aromas, with great structure and complexity, intense color and a balanced acidity, with sharp tannins but already approachable—all the classic components of the great outstanding vintages of Barolo.

The particular conditions of the 2019 vintage, with its warm climate and the absence of extremes (frost, heat spikes), an abundant water supply and a late harvest, allowed the Nebbiolo grape to complete its ripening without any stress Mushroom or Cheese Risotto, and fatty foods, egg pasta dishes.

#### Winemaking

The grapes for the Barbera d'Alba come from the family-owned vineyards in Serraluga d'Alba (Ornato and Colombaro), in Sinio, Diano d'Alba and Grinzane Cavour. There are 15 days of skin contact in stainless steel temperature-controlled fermenters.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The Barbera grapes grown in the Barolo area give full structure, plummy and complex flavor, with spicy and ripe fruit, blackberry aroma and a hint of toasted tobacco. It ages quite well. Vinous, this classic Barbera has a very well balanced acidity and really represents the traditional character of the Barbera grape.





#### Castillo Ygay 2011

Grape varieties: 84% Tempranillo, 16% Mazuelo

#### Manual harvest:

The Tempranillo was harvested on September 17 and 22, and the Mazuelo on September 22, 2011.

#### Winemaking:

Grapes are de-stemmed after going through a selection table. The grape varieties ferment separately in stainless steel tanks, with controlled temperature. The alcoholic fermentation lasts 10-12 days approx. making regularly delestage operations to favor the contact of the must with the skins and extract slowly the aromas and the phenolic compounds Ageing process:

The Mazuelo is ageing for 28 months in French oak 225-litre barrels and the Tempranillo in American oak 225-litre barrels for the same period. 13 months in concrete vats before bottling.

# Dominus **Christian Moueix Tod Mostero** Director of Viticulture and Winemaking

#### Dominus Estate

Upon his discovery of the 124-acre Napanook vineyard in 1981, Christian Moueix founded Dominus Estate to produce one of Napa Valley's most acclaimed caber- net sauvignons. The vineyard's volcanic, well-draining soils are specifically suited to growing Bordeaux varietals, and winemaker Tod Mostero vinifies each dry-farmed parcel separately. Attention to detail is second to none, with minimal intervention allowing the terroir to fully express itself in the wine.

# Dominus

- 124-acre site west of Yountville, the Napanook vineyard was planted in 1838, the oldest in the Napa Valley, each parcel vinified separately
- 1995, Christian Moueix (Châteaux Pétrus, La Fleur-Pétrus, Trotanoy in Pomerol and Magdelaine in Saint-Émilion)became its sole owner. He chose the name 'Dominus' or 'lord of the estate' in latin.
- TOD MOSTERO, winemaker since 2007
- Dominus' winery is the first project realized in the United States by the design architects, Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron
- The property is dry-farmed to allow natural stress and good concentration of fruit. This minimal intervention allows the terroir to fully express itself in the wine. The grape clusters are crop-thinned to allow sun and air to pass in between, helping to achieve full maturation and soften the tannins. Only 20% to 40% new French oak barrels are used in order to limit the extraction of oak notes. 100% French oak
- Rinsing the grapes 10 to 15 days before harvest removes dust and enhances the purity of the fruit. The sunny side of the vines is picked a few days before the shady side respecting perfect maturity.
